AND  Clinical or Counselling Psychology Qualifications awarded on or before 30.09.2018:  Applicants must demonstrate that they have acquired in appropriate health settings in each of the areas of Disability (Child and Adult), Child Psychology, Adult Psychology, at least 60 days or equivalent supervised clinical placements as part of the professional qualification or at least 60 days or equivalent post qualification supervised work experience as a psychologist or a combination of both.  OR  Educational Psychology Qualifications awarded on or before 30.09.2018:  Applicants must demonstrate that they have acquired in appropriate health settings in each of the areas of Child Disability and Child Psychology, at least 60 days or equivalent in supervised clinical placements as part of the professional qualification or at least 60 days or equivalent post qualification supervised work experience as a psychologist or a combination of both. Educational Psychology Qualifications awarded on or after 01.10.2018: Applicants must demonstrate that they have acquired at least 60 days or equivalent supervised clinical placements in appropriate health settings in both areas of Child Disability and Child Psychology as part of the post-graduate professional qualification.

The above eligibility criteria apply without prejudice to applicants employed in a post of Basic Grade Psychologist or above in the Irish public health service at October 2002.

 Be validated by the Department of Health and Children to work in the state.
